WHAT IS AN INSTALLATION OF A NEW PASTOR AND WHY?

The Installation of a Pastor has traditionally been a worship service to mark the beginning of the union or covenant of a new pastor with their congregation. Although it is hard to pinpoint an exact date of origin for this practice, the recognition and affirmation of spiritual leadership (priests, pastors, and deacons), has its foundation in the Old and New Testaments. In <u>A Manual of Worship</u> by John E. Skoglund and Nancy E. Hall by Judson Press, 1993, (both American Baptists),

The Service of Installation is set within "The Service of the Lord's Day" at the time of offertory. It is suggested that a region representative, or another pastor, be invited to "preside". It is described as an "act of dedication" for both the pastor and the congregation as they make promises to each other. Then there is a prayer of blessing and the laying on of hands by the members of the congregation, much like an ordination prayer. The pastor is welcomed publicly.

Recently, The Service of Installation has taken on a broader meaning in the community in which the church resides, with local civic leaders, other pastors, and faith leaders being invited to participate with words of welcome and/or a charge. Often there is a sermon with a guest minister.

We, the First Baptist Church of Rochester, called Rev. Joanne Gilbert-Cannon to serve as our pastor one year ago. With post-pandemic, as well as, staff changes, Church Council and Pastor Joanne postponed a formal Service of Installation. After these months we decided together to opt for a different kind of Installation. Honoring the heart and purpose of it, we "officially install" Joanne as our Pastor today. We will celebrate this union with *a musical service of hope and joy*, this coming Friday night at 7:00 PM, which we are calling *An Installation in a New Key*.
