#### MUSIC NOTES FROM SAM:

As this year's *Black History Month* comes to a close, I call your attention to two men: Mark Fax and David Hurd. (*Please also note Royalties for Spirituals\*\* pg. 4*)

Mark Fax (1911–1974) was a native of Baltimore. He received a Bachelor of Music degree in piano from Syracuse University and a Master of Music degree in composition from the Eastman School of Music. Fax joined the faculty at Howard University in 1947, eventually becoming Director of the School of Music. He has composed for many musical media, including piano, chorus, chamber ensemble, orchestra, and Fax has three operas to his credit.

**David Hurd** (born 1950) is a composer, concert organist, choral director, and educator. He holds degrees from Oberlin Conservatory, UNC Chapel Hill, and Yale University. Hurd currently serves as Director of Music of the Church of St. Mary the Virgin (Times Square), and since 1976 has served as Professor of Church Music and Organist at General Theological Seminary. His many awards and achievements are too numerous to mention here. David Hurd is one of the world's most visible and successful proponents of the organ and sacred music.
