Join us in the Garden Room for a special celebration today immediately following worship. There will be second hour programs including TLC group in the Koinonia Room in the Education Wing, Sermon Talk back in the Chapel, and Choir for our children. Following these programs, anyone who wishes to gather for The Lunch Club, with a bring-your-own lunch, should gather in Hubbell Hall.

High 5 for Cameron - 5 weeks of giving some multiple of \$5. We ask that you challenge yourself to do a little extra this season of Lent for Cameron Community Ministries (CCM). Together we can make a difference by giving to *High 5 for Cameron*. For the <u>five (5) Sundays of Lent</u>, we ask you to make a commitment to give <u>weekly</u> any increment of 5 - \$5, \$15, \$50, \$250 - to the ongoing work of CCM. Considering the recent county's hold on grant funding for our underserved neighbors, these extra funds will help carry them through until the grants are reinstated. What can you give each week? Can you stretch yourself a little through Lent? Make your commitment and give generously. Use **High 5** on check or online! So far we have collected \$1,600 to help CCM keeping *Cameron Cuts* operational. Can we work hard to give a little or give a lot and double that?

"Spotlight" on AT&T's Digital Learning Lab at Cameron. AT&T, the Urban League of Rochester, and CCM teamed up to set up a digital lab. This lab helps bridge the digital divide experienced by marginalized residents of Monroe County who may not have access to technology. The lab is open to youth and adult community members and offers support in computer skills, résumé writing, workforce development, tele-health, computer security, and social media.
